Dear Parents and Carers,

## **RE: Diary dates and key information**

I trust you have had a fantastic summer together with families and friends. We are very much looking forward to having everyone back in school on **Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> August**. An especially warm welcome goes to our new starters in EYFS, who begin their transition days on the 29<sup>th</sup> August, with all children being in full time from Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> September. Details about this transition have already been sent to parents, but they are also on our school website.

**KEY INFORMATION WITH THIS LETTER:** On the following pages, we have taken the time to provide the answers to frequently requested information, an overview of the key dates across the year that you may wish to book time off work to attend, and a full list of all of the currently scheduled events and activities that are taking place over the course of the whole academic year. Please take note of the following parts in particular:

- How class Dojo and the School Office should be used for two-way communication - Class Dojo is for communication about learning whilst all other communication such as reporting pupil absence/illness, going home arrangements or urgent messages must be through the school office.
- The school's legal requirements to monitor pupil attendance and how this is done.
- Public Health guidance on how long to stay off school for different illnesses.
- Allergy awareness and how the school can support with administering medicines in school.
- Respectful parking, safe use of bikes/scooters and the rules around bringing a dog to school.
- How to get involved with the Friends of Desford Community Primary School (FODCPS) and raise funds.

**PARENT SURVEYS:** We have been reviewing the responses on the parent surveys that were sent out in January and June last academic year and have made a number of changes that we would like to update you on in relation to your feedback on communication. We will share and respond to the wider outcomes from the survey in due course. For now, here is a summary of the key changes we have made to communication and parent interaction:

- The Website diary has been updated with all relevant activities and events that have currently been planned. This should be seen as the go to place for dates. You can add the diary to your own mobile device if you choose by clicking the link on the website. A summary of these dates, as included on the following pages, will also be sent to parents at regular intervals over the course of the year, with reminders being sent from the office nearer the time.
- To avoid confusion, staff have been asked to only use Class Dojo for sharing news about activities and learning that have been happening in school, all other information about upcoming activities and events should be sent to you from the school office using ParentMail.
- We have reviewed the number of opportunities that parents have to come into school and created a new program of opportunities over the course of the year. These include:
  - **Year group assemblies:** a celebration and display of work and learning over previous weeks.
  - **Class Visits:** An informal opportunity to look at work and/or chat to the teacher.
  - **Open Mornings/trips:** The opportunity to help in class or on a school trip.

Many of these have already been scheduled and are included in the attached dates/website calendar.

**FURTHER UPDATES:** Further updates to expect this term are:

- An overview of curriculum linked school trips, visits and residentials for each year group.
- Access to comprehensive overviews of our recently re-modelled curriculum so that you can view more detail about what your child will be learning in each subject and in each year group.
- How to become a volunteer at Desford Primary. You may be interested in getting involved in school life a little more by helping with reading or in the library for example. There will be a volunteer induction evening for interested parents later this term.

**SCHOOL DINNERS:** An information leaflet and new menu has been sent to you separately. The headlines are that we are no longer using an external contractor for providing school meals. LiFE MAT have employed staff to work in our kitchen and the menus will now have the flexibility to be changed to meet the needs and popularity of our children.

**SCHOOL UNIFORM:** School uniform is proven to impact positively on school culture and identity, and improves respectful behaviour. With all children in the school colours, it ensures fairness and equality. We ask that all children comply with the agreed uniform colours, but we do not insist upon these having the school logo. Second hand uniform is also available for purchase from the school, please contact the school office if you are interested in this. Where children come to school without school uniform, we will support them by providing spare uniform for the day so that they are included with the rest of the children. **TERM DATES:** The school website has the term dates on it for this academic year. Term dates for the 2024-25 academic year are currently being set by the LiFE MAT central team. We will circulate these by email and add them to the website as soon as we have received them. Please always check our website for term dates when booking holidays, the Leicestershire County Council term dates may differ slightly from ours.

### **SCHOOL ADMISSIONS**

If you have a pre-school child who will be starting school in EYFS next academic year (August 2024), or a child who will be moving to secondary school in a year's time (just starting in year 6), you need to visit the primary school admissions portal on the Leicestershire County Council website. The deadline for Secondary Admissions is 31<sup>st</sup> October 2023, and for Primary Admissions is 16<sup>th</sup> January 2024. It is recommended that you put more than one choice of school down in case your first choice does not have spaces. ## Communication & Engagement

In addition to the website, assemblies, class visits, performances, parents' evenings and reports, there are several other ways in which parental communication and engagement is enabled.

- **ParentMail and Class Dojo** are the main forms of written communication – information about these is in the general information on the following pages.
- **The classroom door:** Staff welcome brief questions and queries at the end of the school day. Please approach staff at the classroom door when they have finished seeing children out.
- **Face to face or phone call:** Where more time or privacy is needed, please arrange a mutually agreeable time to meet face to face or to have a phone call.
- **School Volunteers:** After completing a safeguarding induction, we welcome parent volunteers to assist with reading or other tasks in the classroom to gain experience in schools or simply to be more involved with school life.
- **Open mornings/trips:** Parents will sometimes be invited to help out with activities with the children in school or on school trips, giving a snapshot of what it is like to be a child at DCPS.

## Pupil Sickness and Diarrhoea

## School Communication

### School Office

Most information will be sent to you via the ParentMail App which also links with your email.

#### Please use the school office to:

- Inform us about pupil collection arrangements.
- Make Payment for clubs, trips or dinners.

#### What to expect from the ParentMail:

- Newsletters and important information.
- Notification about upcoming events.
- Booking details for before/after school clubs.
- A response to any enquiries.

### ClassDojo

Class Dojo forms part of our behaviour system in school and is a direct link to the classroom.

#### Parents/carers are invited to use Class Dojo to:

- Ask questions about learning or behaviour
- Arrange a meeting with the class teacher
- Make enquiries about homework

#### What to expect from Class Dojo:

- A short response to your messages within 48hrs
- Photos and information about class activities
- Automated pupil behaviour reports
- Messages from staff to arrange meetings

Staff are not required to respond to enquiries outside of their working hours, at weekends or during school holidays. **Dojo Messages may not be seen until after the end of the school day.**

## **URGENT MESSAGES SHOULD ALWAYS BE CALLED THROUGH TO THE SCHOOL OFFICE**

**School Attendance:** Good school attendance is central to raising standards in pupil progress and attainment so we therefore require our pupils to attend school regularly and on time.

Schools are required by law to monitor pupil attendance and punctuality. Where attendance or punctuality falls below 96% (approximately 8 school days per year), we will work with families to help with improving their attendance. Where this is not successful, an Attendance Welfare Service will be commissioned by the school to support and address any outstanding attendance or welfare concerns. ## Administering Medicines

Although schools are not required to administer any medicine for children, at Desford Community Primary School we make every effort to be able to support the administering of medicines for your child. To make this manageable, we generally administer all medicine in one go at approximately 12:00pm. Please complete a consent form and speak to the school office about the process for doing this. We are unable to administer medicine without consent.

## Allergy Awareness



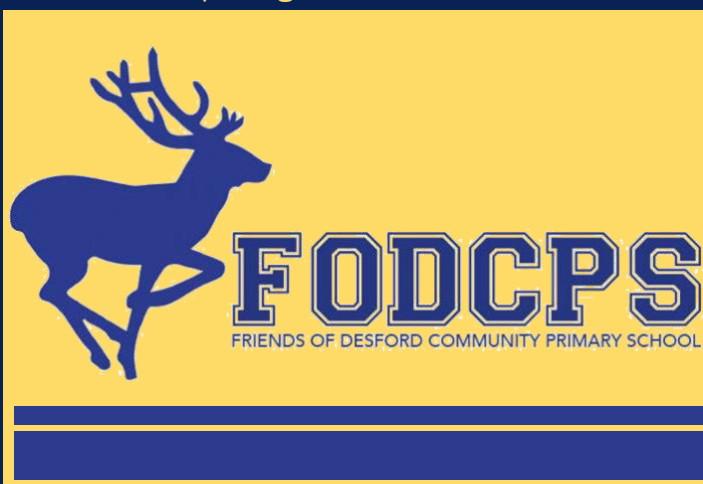
